BELONG

Ask this Ice Breaker Question: Can you share a fond memory from your childhood that reminds you of feeling loved and cared for?

BELIEVE

Have someone in your group read aloud: Matthew 22:15-22

Ask these questions to prompt group discussion:

1. The Pharisees could have simply held a charitable dialogue with Jesus. Instead, they tried to trap him. Why do you think political conversations often turn negative?

Leader Context (Not to be read aloud):

- 2. Jesus' response separates the realms of Caesar and God. How do you think we apply this principle ("render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's"?) in our lives today, balancing our civic duties and spiritual commitments?

- Another option is to simplify and reduce each area of our life.
